Annually, he co-chairs the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater Company Opening Night Gala at the Kennedy Center, the National Hispanic Foundation for the Arts Gala and The First Tee Politics and Pros Golf Classic and is a board member of PGA’s First Tee of Greater DC, the National Democratic Club and an advisory council member of The LBJ School.
